A Message From the President

Whenever we accept dogs into our assistance dog program or shelter the utmost concern in our minds is "what is best for the dog". Do they enjoy working or would they be best just being loved by a family and playing ball all day? If they are fearful or aggressive, do we recommend that it would be best for them to depart to the rainbow bridge or live their life in fear or in a small kennel because they can't be trusted?

Recently, I had an extremely difficult personal decision to make about one of the dogs. We received an application from a woman who is hearing impaired. Several years earlier I had helped her train her own dog as a signal dog. The dog died of medical problems and she was in great need of a new signal dog. When a person has grown to trust and rely on an assistance dog, losing that dog is like losing the ability to hear or use your arms all over again. Looking at all the dogs we had at the appropriate age and level of training, I struggled with finding the dog that also had the right personality to match this person.

The only dog I thought that would match this woman was a dog who was not slated to be an assistance dog. He was my demo dog Dashiell. Dash was the first dog I ever acquired for Circle Tail (free pup on the side of the road). I took him to school with me when I became a certified Master Dog Trainer. He helped me get an "A" in school and was the only "mutt" in class. Since then he learned service and signal work and would go to demonstrations with me along with Abby, my primary demo dog. Gradually, as more dogs arrived in the house for fostering and pet therapy, Dash didn't get to go places as often. Abby was more stoic and didn't require the attention that Dash did in public. I started thinking "Poor Dash, he loves to work so much I wish I had the time to work him more. He is so happy, with his huge puppy smile, every time you ask him to open the refrigerator or door, retrieve items off the floor, go for a ride, wake me up in the morning, or let me know his water bowl was empty." I came to the difficult decision that Dash would be happiest being a working dog and that partnering him as a signal dog was the right thing to do.

Currently, Dash is working as a signal dog and doing great. I get to see him almost weekly and still get to give him belly rubs. His picture is the wallpaper on my computer. To love him the best I could, I had to let him be the happiest he could. And he is happiest working. Circle Tail is in need of great people to be short-term foster families. So, if you are considering fostering an assistance dog in training, but think it is too hard to give the dog back, it is! But the joy you receive from seeing the dog you love make life better for another human is worth it, and every tear of sadness for yourself turns to tears of joy for your dog and the individual you are helping! Partnership Updates!



Circle Tail has now partnered 17 assistance dog teams. The last quarter was very busy with 5 teams being trained in a period of 5 months. We have had an increased request for emotional support assistance dogs and those teams have demonstrated the immense benefit that an assistance dog can provide to a person with a disability, whether it is physical or emotional. Be sure to check or website for our frequent partnership updates!

- Cheryl and Bryce (Cincinnati, OH): Bryce is a chocolate Lab found wandering the streets. He was partnered as an emotional support dog with Cheryl in November after her first assistance dog died of old age and medical conditions. Bryce received his basic and advanced training at Circle Tail and the Ross Correctional Institute. He is a huge comfort to Cheryl when she needs to relax through "pet" therapy. To relax, Bryce loves to carry his gorilla stuffed toy around and play ball.
- Tina and Stone (Cincinnati, OH): Stone is a long-haired Weimaraner. He was one of the first pups we had in the assistance dog program 3 years ago. He received almost all of his training at the Chillicothe Correctional Institute. He was partnered with Tina in December, 2001. He provides balance when she is walking, gets her medicine when the timer goes off, and retrieves dropped items. Stone has quickly bonded to Tina responding to many of her needs. They love to play ball in the back yard. To relax, he enjoys destroying tennis balls with his jaws.
- Melissa and Carbon (Crown Point, OH): Carbon is a Rott/Lab mix who was donated by a woman who rescues dogs in Indiana. She received most of her training at the Chillicothe Correctional Institute. Carbon was partnered with Melissa as an emotional support dog in January, 2002 and provides comfort to her when she is stressed, gives her a focal point to concentrate on when she wants to withdraw and retrieves her medicine to make her feel better. To relax, Carbon loves to snuggle, chew her bone and pretend she is a lap dog!
- Jean and Scruffy (Gallipolis, OH): Scruffy is a mixed breed dog who was rescued from a kill shelter as a pup by a local woman. She donated him to Circle Tail when he was about 9 months old. Scruffy has been in several of the Correctional Facilities and was partnered as an emotional support dog in February 2002 with Jean. He provides comfort to Jean and helps her go out into public. She is taking him on walks outside which is a huge step for her regaining some of her independence. To relax, he enjoys hanging out getting pets.
- Toni and Dashiell (Cincinnati, OH): Dash is a mixed breed dog who was the first Circle Tail assistance dog in training. (Since Marlys fostered him, he took much longer to train!) He was partnered as a signal dog with Toni in March. Currently the two are bonding, and Dashiell is working on signaling Toni to the door, alarm clock, telephone, her name and other common sounds. This is Toni's second signal dog, and she is looking forward to the companionship and security that a dog provides her. Dashiell is having the time of his life working, going to parties and events, taking long walks with his new partner and squeaking his stuffed toys.

Assistance Dog Team Spotlight

Bryanna and Maggie (Crown Point, Oh): Maggie is a 4 year old Lab Mix who was partnered in September 2001 as an emotional support dog with 12-year-old Bryanna. They hit it off right from the start, and Maggie seemed to know Bry's need for her right away. Maggie is now attending school with Bryanna, which is a big step for both of them. Maggie lays on her "place" mat during class and sits on the sidelines during gym. Bry has taken Maggie many places, including volleyball practice, shopping, 4-H, and to her grandmother's house for sleep-overs. She is looking forward to camping with Maggie this summer. 
Wish List

PETsMART Charities Grant Received!

Circle Tail received a generous grant from PETSMART Charities to fund a new program that focuses on prevention of unwanted litters of pets by creating a plan to break the cycle that causes pet overpopulation. Beginning in April, Circle Tail will take in pregnant dogs to term and provide medical and physical care, along with spaying and neutering the mother and her litter. The healthy spayed mother is returned to her home after delivery and care of her puppies is complete. The puppies are cared for, spayed / neutered, and remain at Circle Tail until placement through adoptions. Our mission with this innovative and aggressive program will minimize euthanasia as a means of controlling pet overpopulation. Thank you to PETSMART Charities for making this goal a reality!
