Tails from the Inside

A Story from a Circle Tail inmate canine handler at Ohio Reformatory for Women

Being a part of Circle Tail's program has made a big impact in my life. I've learned in order to be a good dog trainer you have to be firm, fair, consistent, and loving to your pet. I have built confidence on top of confidence. It's an endless process. The knowledge that I have absorbed in my mind about dogs and their different breeds and personalities gives me a new and positive outlook on life. After being incarcerated for 13 years, I now have a reason to set new goals and achieve them. Observing techniques of individual trainers has helped broaden my horizons on different training techniques. It's been a huge challenge for me, but the more I learned, the better of a trainer I've become.

Every dog l've had in the past couple years has taught me something new:

- Mork, who loved to take the trash out, and how it became his favorite chore of the house.
- Seren, who taught me that assisting and helping people, is what she wanted to do and a reminder of what I want to continue to do.
- Truman, who has taught me love, courage and to never give up. The warmth that he has shared with everyone here.
- Let's not forget about Henry! While taking care of business, the toilet paper rolled across the floor. When telling Henry to take it he went straight over to the tissue and put it in his mouth. When told to bring it, he came over and put the tissue right in my hands. At that moment when he looked at me I knew right then that there's a purpose for what I do. I looked at him and said, "Yes! Good Boy!"

I guess you can say that every day is a challenge, but when you set goals and live to achieve them, in the end, you can look back on your accomplishments. There's no greater love than the love and loyalty of a canine, and the feeling of my contribution and training that I have put forth: to enrich the life of the dog and the individual.

We'll be able to put some furnishings and equipment in the new training & education center, thanks to the **Kenneth A. Scott Charitable Trust, A KeyBank Trust.** The grant will cover folding chairs, tables, table and chair carts, a dry erase board, projector screen, and floor mats.

Crating your New Dog Tips for previously crate-trained dogs in transition Visit our website for the complete article

#1 Adopt the crate when you adopt the dog. When an adopted dog recognizes and settles into a routine that includes his/her own space, s/he is better prepared to learn how to live in your space in the months and years to come.

#2 Bait the Crate. The idea is to make the crate the ONLY source of several things the dog loves: regular meals, favorite toys, treats and chewies. If the crate is the source--- the only source--- of all things wonderful (except time with you, of course!), you and the dog both win.

#3 **Watchfully Ignore**. This one can be tough! What to do when your dog's whining, barking or frantic in the crate? If you know the dog's needs for food, water, exercise and elimination were taken care of before crating, odds are your pooch is in testing mode. Try your best to ignore these attention-seeking behaviors. You can quietly acknowledge the dog once s/he settles down. Your dog should sit or remain calm while unlatching and then opening the door. Any charging is met by a shut crate door. The dog must be calm before the door is opened again.


